

## Forklift License Cambridge

Forklift License Cambridge - Within North America, obtaining a forklift license or forklift certification involves classroom and hands-on training. Regulatory control over licensing, certification and training for powered industrial truck operators falls under the jurisdiction of provincial, federal and state groups. Operators could obtain a license either through training administered by the employer or by a third party. In any case, regulatory requirements should be met. Recertification is needed every two to three years.

Forklifts are powered industrial trucks which come with a variety of alternatives, such as stand-up and sit-down. There are different types and sizes of forklift suitable for various industrial uses. Operator training programs are normally individualized in order to deal with the particular kinds and uses for which the operator is training. Training on a sit-down, gas-powered lift truck in a warehouse setting would not be the same as training on a propane-powered, stand-up forklift in a shipyard. The different lift trucks and their applications makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all industries and equipment. Regulatory standards, therefore, have a tendency not to concentrate on particular program requirements but rather on the results of individual training courses.

On the job training that is offered by the employer is the most common way of forklift training certification and licensing. The employer who offers this method of certification is required to provide practical training and classroom sessions on machinery at their place of work. Employers can choose to train personnel on every kind of forklift separately, or to train them on all machinery combined. The curriculum incorporates forklift operation procedures, safety procedures, company regulations and lift truck maintenance. Subject matters particular to the worksite, such as hazardous conditions or materials, should be included. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely utilize and operate each and every kind of lift truck on the worksite.

Certification through a third-party vendor usually requires an on-site component with hands-on practice.

It must be noted that certifications provided by an employer do not transfer from one employer to the next. Receiving a lift truck license through employer-provided training enables the operator to operate a lift truck for that employer only.

Forklift safety would always be an essential factor of the lift truck license training, though the specifics of the safety training would be dependent upon the equipment being used. Certain safety problems would differ for every employer and industry. Both third-party providers and employer-provided training may have to deal with additional requirements for safety training in applicable industries, like for instance in offshore and marine operations.
